16. When you do squats, are your knees supposed

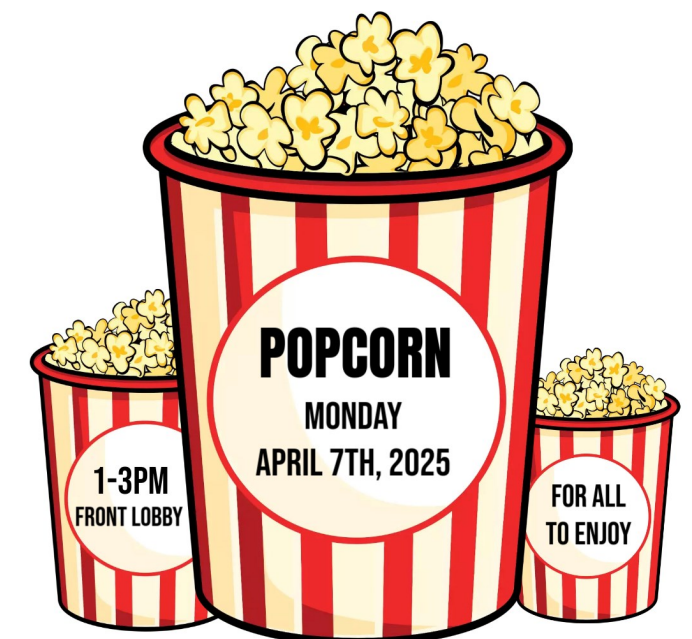
